

OFFICIAL COUNTY COMMISSIONERS PROCEEDINGS
APRIL 3, 2018

The Board of County Commissioners met in regular session in the Commissioners Meeting Room of the Sublette County Courthouse in Pinedale, Wyoming, on this date at 9:00 a.m. with Andy Nelson, Joel Bousman, David Burnett, Tom Noble, Mack Rawhouser, Holly Dabb of the Pinedale Roundup, and Mary Lankford, County Clerk present.

Chairman Nelson led those present in the Pledge of Allegiance.

The minutes of the preceding regular meeting of March 20, 2018, were approved and ordered filed on motion by Commissioner Burnett and seconded by Commissioner Rawhouser. The motion carried.

The official bond was approved for Mike Henn, Secretary Treasurer for the Fair Board, in the amount of \$5,000 was approved and ordered filed with the County Treasurer.

Commissioner Rawhouser discussed the LaBarge Creek easements and it was agreed that efforts should continue to secure the remaining easements.

Butch Penton, Road and Bridge Superintendent, reported that no information has been received from the Forest Service concerning the Skyline Drive rocks.

Mike Jackson, representing Rio Verde Engineering, reported that the easements for the Skyline Drive are acceptable. It was moved by Commissioner Bousman and seconded by Commissioner Burnett to accept the proposed easements. The motion carried. Deputy County Attorney Matt Gaffney will notify Central Federal Lands.

The Board discussed the roads to be included in the Schedule A maintenance plan. An updated priority list is needed.

Billy Pape, Waste Management Superintendent, and Eric Sackett, Rio Verde Engineering, reported on baler repair completion, tires, slopes and seeding, and compacting. It was reported that current life of the working cell is 3-5 years. The DEQ permit should be issued this month.

Sheriff KC Lehr reported on crisis management, the upcoming Polaris event at the Fairgrounds on April 12th, Alice training at the schools, and the Hill climb. A letter received from WYDOT concerning confusion about WyoLink costs was discussed.

It was moved by Commissioner Bousman and seconded by Commissioner Noble to approve a request from the Eagle Bar for a catering permit for the LaBarge Gun Bash on April 14, 2018, at the Sublette County Fairgrounds. The motion carried.

It was moved by Commissioner Rawhouser and seconded by Commissioner Noble to approve a request from the Waterhole #3 for a catering permit for the Muley Fanatic Banquet on April 7, 2018, at the Sublette County Fairgrounds. The motion carried.

The following abatement petitions and affidavits of abatement of taxes were presented on petition from the County Assessor and the State of Wyoming Board of Equalization: Exxon Mobil Corporation, \$407,740.59 and Ultra Resources, Inc., \$71,370.12.

It was moved by Commissioner Noble and seconded by Commissioner Burnett to approve the proposed amendments to the PAC Joint Powers Agreement, as presented at the last meeting. The motion carried.

It was moved by Commissioner Burnett and seconded by Commissioner Bousman to accept the FY17 Financial Audit, as presented by Paul Stille of Leo Riley & Company. The motion carried.

County Clerk Mary Lankford reported that budget worksheets will be distributed this week and reviewed the budget letter request.

Joan Mitchell, representing the Southwest Sublette Pioneers, discussed the dishwasher. The Board approved purchase of a new dishwasher by the Center.

The Board reviewed the Senior Joint Powers Board MOU for the property adjacent to the senior living facilities. It was moved by Commissioner Burnett and seconded by Commissioner Rawhouser to approve the MOU and deed Blocks 1, 4, &5, Pioneer Addition to the Senior Joint Powers Board. The motion carried.

It was moved by Commissioner Noble and seconded by Commissioner Rawhouser to recess the meeting for an Executive Session, in accordance with W.S. 16-4-405(a)(iii) to discuss potential litigation. The motion carried.

It was moved by Commissioner Noble and seconded by Commissioner Rawhouser to reconvene the meeting.

Old Business: Commissioner Rawhouser commented on the articles about PILT and SRS in the local newspapers, and the expenses reported in the article. Commissioner Noble reported on the upcoming kickoff of the CTC contract. Commissioner Burnett reported that he will be participating in a conference call this week concerning the Prevention program. Commissioner Bousman reported on participating in a conference call concerning the Department of Interior reorganization and the Wyoming Resource Coalition; and attending a meeting at the Regional

Forest Service Office in Salt Lake City concerning reduction in the NEPA process and timber management. Chairman Nelson had nothing to report.
