In addition to the above, please review the following that may be applicable to your purchase:		
	1.	Current mileage if the vehicle is model year 2011 or newer
	2.	If your vehicle is financed, we will need the loan agreement from the bank or credit union
	3.	If the vehicle is a truck, trailer, or camper, we will need to know the dry, empty weight if it is not already included on the title.
	4.	The factory price, also known as Manufacturer's Suggested Retail Price, from when the vehicle was brand new.

Finally, we will need to collect your fees as follows:

- \$15.00 title fee
- \$10.00 VIN inspection fee (if applicable)
- \$20.00 fee to file your lien for financing (if applicable)

Sales Tax **MUST** be paid before we can give you the title.
